The American Institute of Architects (Denver) Recognizes 2009 Achievements in Architecture

DENVER (Sept. 12, 2009) — The American Institute of Architects (AIA), Denver chapter, recognized its 2009 architectural design, honor and president’s awards recipients during a ceremony on Sept. 11, at The Pepsi Center.

Design Awards

The following nine architectural design awards were selected from 66 entries submitted by members of AIA Denver and judged by a jury of architects and design experts from New York. These were presented by AIA Denver Design Awards Jury Chair Bruce Fowle, FAIA, of FXFOWLE Architects (New York).

AIA Denver 2009 Honor Awards

In addition to the design awards, three honor awards were presented by AIA Denver Honor Awards Jury member Gerardo Salinas, AIA, who is senior associate at Anderson Mason Dale Architects, in Denver.

Lifetime Achievement Award: Peter Dominick Jr., FAIA, posthumously, formerly of 4240 Architecture (Denver)
This award recognizes an architect that has made significant contributions to AIA, the profession and the citizens of Denver.

25-year Award: Auraria Library (Denver) by Helmut Jahn, FAIA
This award recognizes the enduring quality of architectural design and that has withstood the “test of time” and still functions in its original capacity.

James Sudler, AIA, Award For Contribution to AIA Denver: Denver Architectural Foundation (Denver)
This award recognizes an outstanding contribution to the chapter and achievements of people who have, by their professionalism, dedication, leadership, ability and commitment, improved the quality of services offered by AIA Denver.

Finally, five President’s Awards were presented by AIA Denver 2009 President Steve Carr, AIA. These awards are presented to individuals who have made extraordinary contributions in supporting the mission of AIA Denver or local architecture and are selected at the discretion of the chapter president.
