The American Institute of Architects (Denver) Recognizes 2010 Achievements in Architecture

DENVER (Sept. 28, 2010) — The American Institute of Architects (AIA), Denver chapter, recognized its 2010 architectural design, honor and president's awards recipients during a ceremony on Friday, Sept. 24, at Mile High Station.
