AIA Denver Takes Part in Celebration of Colorado Architecture Month Several free events and educational activities offered throughout the month of April

March 18, 2009 (Denver) — The Denver chapter of The American Institute of Architects (AIA Denver) will host and sponsor several free events and educational opportunities for the public during April to celebrate Colorado Architecture Month.

Events and programs range from educational seminars on how to work with an architect, to a merging of art and architecture during Architecture, Art and Appetizers, to the ever-popular Box City Event, where children experience the design and construction industry firsthand by requesting permits, ordering materials, designing buildings and constructing those buildings into a cardboard city.
